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Some Common Concerns!

I forgot my music/speech book! What happens?

- Come to Room 101
- Without a legal edition you cannot place in a class. You will be able to perform, but for adjudication only.

How many copies of music do I need to bring?

Soloist/ Choral Speech

- 1 legal edition for the adjudicator
- If you have an accompanist, they must also have a legal edition with them.

Chamber & Choral:

- 1 full legal edition of the score with all parts for the adjudicator.
- Each member performing must have an original copy of their part including the accompanist.

My selections take longer to perform than the time limit for my class?

The time limits are in the syllabus. If your performance is longer than the time limit, you will receive adjudication only - no mark and no placement in the class.

May I use music to perform, or do I have to memorize my pieces?

All solo selections performed at the Provincial Festival must be memorized, except Music Composition, Creative Story Telling, Class 320, woodwind and Brass.

What Can I Perform at the Provincial Festival?

All competitors will perform 2 selections (except Musical Theatre, Composition, Piano Concertos, and String Sonata.) All selections performed at the Provincial Festival must have been adjudicated at your Local Festival.

Can I practice in the Performance Room?

NO!! If you or your accompanist use rooms scheduled for performances, you will be disqualified.

Here are some things you might want to know ahead of time.

When are the Provincial Festivals?

The Provincial Festivals take place:

1. Choral Festival
Sunday, May 28 – Tues, May 30, 2017
2. Solo/Chamber/Choral Speech Festival
Sunday, May 28 – June 3, 2017

Where are the Provincial Festivals held?

The Provincial Festivals are held in Edmonton, AB at 2 adjacent locations:

- 1) Grant MacEwan University, Alberta College Campus (10050 Macdonald Drive) – Solos, Chamber & Practice rooms
- 2) McDougall United Church (10025-101 St) – Choral, Choral Speech and Vocal Solos

When do I find out where and when I perform?

A master schedule should have been given to you by your local festival along with this brochure.

A more detailed schedule will be available about a week before festival starts. It will be posted on the official Alberta Music Festival Website (www.albertamusicfestival.org). Each participant will be responsible to check in which session he/she will perform. You will not receive any other notification.

When do I need to arrive and how long do I need to stay?

It is important for you to be ready to perform at the start of your session. If your class is divided into two sections, you are welcome to sit in on the other section. **Music or speech selections must be given to the adjudicator's secretary (in the performance room) at the beginning of your section.**

What if I can't stay for both sections of my class?

Adjudication sheets and certificates are presented only when the whole class is finished. If there are 2 sections to the class, certificates and adjudication sheets are handed out after the second section is finished. The adjudicator will make comments at the end of the first section.

If you are in a 2 section class and **cannot stay for both sections**, you should:

- a. pick up your music at the end of your section
- b. make arrangements for someone from your festival to collect your adjudication sheet or
- c. stop at the Festival Office (Room 101 at Alberta College) and request that your adjudication sheet and certificate be mailed to you

Are warm up rooms available? Yes. These are **warm-up rooms** only. You will be given 10 minutes in the room (if available). **AMFA cannot supply longer practice times.** If you need a longer practice time, it is your responsibility to make separate arrangements.

How do I book a Warm-Up room?

To book a room:

- Bookings will run from:
 - 8:00-10:00 (for morning sessions)
 - 11:30-1:30 (for afternoon sessions)
 - 4:30-6:30 (for evening sessions)
- Bookings are handled at a table located in the main foyer of Alberta College.
- Certain rooms are available for warm-up during the sessions.

PLEASE NOTE: These are **NOT** practice rooms, they are only for warmup. If you want a practice room, you will need to arrange for this on your own.

What Do I do If I Place First in my Class?

You need to go to the Room 101 and write a thank you note to the donors of your scholarship and plaque. Once you have written the thank you card, you will receive your scholarship cheque.

What should I wear?

What you wear should be appropriate to the circumstances.

1. Concert Classes
 - Boys/Men must wear dress pants or suits/sport jacket.
 - Girls/Women should be in concert dress or business casual.
 2. Musical Theatre / Speech Classes
 - Competitors should wear an appropriate costume or a suggestion of a costume.
- Jewelry, if worn at all, should be small pieces and should not “jingle”.

Is there a place for groups to stay?
